The following excerpt from the AAUW Public Action Network illustrates where some of the LAF monies are allocated.

After more than two years of advocacy from AAUW members, including a call-in day at the 2013 national convention, President Barack Obama issued two equal pay executive orders on Equal Pay Day of this year.

AAUW celebrated the fifth anniversary of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. AAUW was proud to host Lilly's trip to Washington, D.C., for the anniversary of her namesake law. Ledbetter attended the 2014 State of the Union, sat down for a live interview on MSNBC, met with 15 U.S. senators, answered questions before dozens of House members and spoke on a national call with members of congress and 16,000 activists. AAUW also helped Ledbetter publish op-eds in the Washington Post and Forbes in conjunction with her trip to D.C; we believe these op-eds played a critical role in urging the president to sign the fair pay executive orders highlighted above.
