Our program will feature Eileen and David Littig presenting an exciting new project in Brown County called **Connecting Our Community from Many Directions.** Participants seek to shape our community by connecting with each other based on Appreciative Inquiry. A traditional problem solving approach begins with the negative, namely: what is the problem and how to fix what is broken, focus is on obstacles. The Appreciative Inquiry approach starts with what is going well and searches for solutions by amplifying what is working, focus is placed on the positives.

Participants interview people from all walks of life and record positive stories describing their hopes and dreams. Stories are made available on social media in hopes of shaping a positive public dialog. It is hoped that these positive stories will lower barriers, increase cooperation and open paths for realizing dreams. Community members and project participants are also invited to participate in sessions to discuss what their stories and dreams tell us and how we can use the positives in our community to create future possibilities and projects connecting our community.

#### LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND/PUBLIC POLICY Stella Frigo

Our Federal Judiciary has a serious backlog problem. "The Senate's inaction has consequences. Federal courts are often also the last, best hope for women who have experienced discrimination in education, employment, health care, and other aspects of their lives. Since the beginning of 2015, the number of current circuit and district court vacancies has increased from 40 to 59. The number of those that are judicial emergencies has increased from 12 to 28. Despite the increased need to fill these positions, Senate consideration of judicial nominees has slowed down significantly."

"Tell your senators to urge Majority Leader McConnell to schedule "up or down" confirmation votes and ask Sen. Grassley to hold consistent confirmation hearings to end judicial emergencies and federal courts' backlog!" from AAUW Action Network
