The February Meeting at the Mauthe Center on Preventing Sexual Assault was very informative and interesting. I was impressed with the women working on the issue as well as the programs they have initiated to bring awareness of the issue to the campus. I was most struck by the fact women acknowledged that they had been forced to have sexual relations when they did not want to, but did not acknowledge this action as "rape." Similarly men admitted they forced a woman to have sexual relations, but did not acknowledge this as rape. Another interesting fact is that when a school is successful on these matters, one of the signs is that they have more documented cases. UWGB is lucky to have received a grant, because that money allows them to do more.

Thank you to all who helped with advertising, the food, setting it up and the clean up. I loved the space at the Mauthe Center. It was large but not overwhelming. We did attract a few students who seemed to enjoy the program. Clearly our goal of improving our relationship with UWGB is working. I think we have developed some trust. Our Mary Barker and UWGB's Christine Smith are cooperating on a presentation on the AAUW program showing women how to negotiate a salary. They plan to present it at UWGB this spring.

<u>Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in</u> <u>Leadership</u>

Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in Leadership is AAUW's latest report that is scheduled for release this spring. It will explore why women's representation in paid leadership positions is so low and will discuss the complex reasons why there are so few women in politics, business and some areas of academia. As a part of this research AAUW is working with Harvard University to develop an implicit bias test to figure out what prejudices people still hold about women in leadership positions. Implicit biases are something you are not necessarily aware that you have. We all have some cultural prejudices that we may intellectually know are not rational, but they may affect our decisions and attitudes.

You can help AAUW's research and find out what implicit biases about women in leadership you may have by taking the test yourself. Your test can help AAUW formulate recommendations that can change the face of leadership. The test can be found at www.aaua.org/research/barriers-and-bias.
